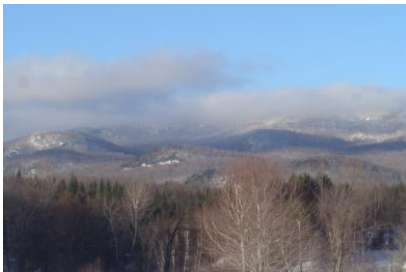


Stanley Lake granting a conservation servitude to the Ruitter Valley Land Trust.
